# A Note From The Executive Director

Dear Friends of Boys Hope Girls Hope,

In early 2018, Boys Hope Girls Hope of Colorado made the decision to transition from a residential program to one with the sole focus on Academy and College programs. In looking at ongoing sustainability, efficacy, the overall strength of our program, and our ability to meet the needs of the bright and talented students in our communities, we felt this was the best course for all our scholars and collegians. This began with the 2018-19 school year and carried the goal of increasing the number of scholars served, expanding our partnerships with more schools, and ultimately increasing the number of college graduates via our programs.

As I write to you today, BHGHCO has increased the number of scholars attending Regis Jesuit High School from 7 in FY18 to 16 currently. We also have a scholar who attends Grandview High School and we have gone from serving 5 collegians in 2016 to 45 in FY20.

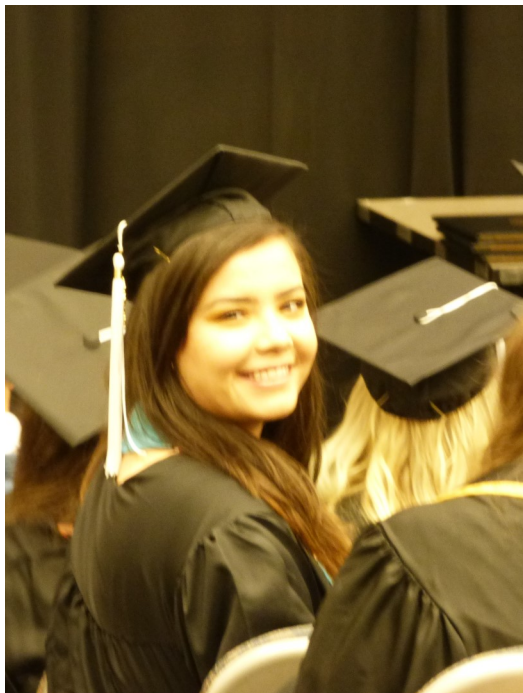
This new direction has allowed us to serve a larger population and more scholars moving forward. It is our goal to lead as many students of potential through high school and college as possible. Focusing our efforts on the Academy and College programs helps us to achieve this ultimate goal. The students have continued to succeed in amazing ways. In May, 2019, 13 graduating seniors were accepted to 47 colleges and universities and earned over \$1.4 million dollars in scholarships. All were enrolled in college for Fall 2019. College scholarships received included the Boettcher, Aurora Gives, and Alpha Phi Alpha. Current collegians are receiving prestigious scholarships including the Daniels, Horatio Alger, Distinguished Scholars at Colorado Mesa University, Evans and Reischer.

Your support continues to make these incredible stories possible. Your gifts provide our scholars the opportunity to forever change their future and for that, we are incredibly grateful to you.

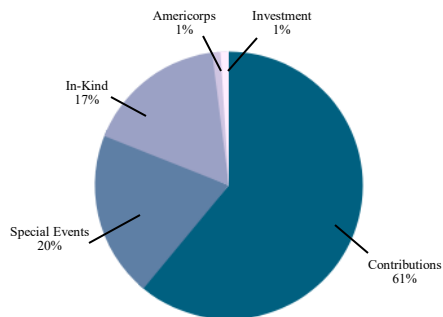

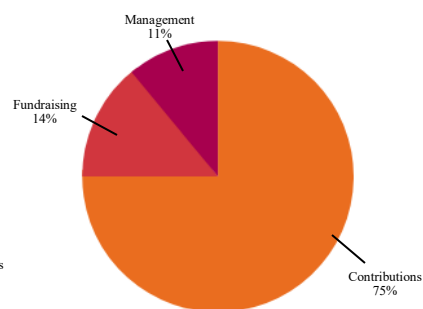
