I was 14 years old when I got my first job and Boys Hope Girls Hope was right there, teaching me time management. I was 16 when I received my nursing license because of the encouragement Boys Hope Girls Hope provided. I graduated high school at the top of my class and received the Daniels Scholarship because Boys Hope Girls Hope was in the background helping me edit my essays. 
